

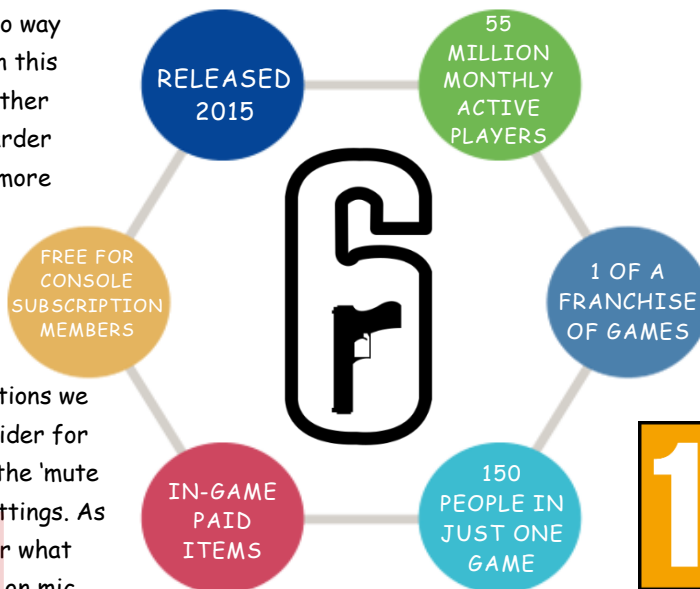
Tom Clancy's Rainbow Six is a Franchise of games, in a Terrorists Vs. Cops style tactical shooter. There are a couple of versions of the game, and it is generally very skilled & tactical. There is Rainbow Six: Quarantine due for release some time in 2021, which is likely to raise the profile of the franchise back to its immensely popular level.

### If you want to report, you can do so in a couple of easy steps.

1. If you are in the game, go to the 'matchmaking' screen by pressing select. Then select the player and hit report.
2. If you have left the game, go to the console menu, and report a player using a "report player" feature in the social section.

Surprisingly, there is no way to turn the 'gore' off in this game, unlike a lot of other shooters. Making it harder to make the graphics more child friendly.

One of the core functions we would ask you to consider for your younger users is the 'mute player' option in the settings. As there is no filter for what other users may say on mic whilst playing the game.



To really confuse its users, depending on the version of the game you buy, will determine the PEGI Rating. Vegas, Vegas 2, Lockdown & Rogue Spear are all a 16. Rainbow Six Siege (newest) is an 18.

# Rainbow Six



## Positive Points

1. As a game, it is one of the highest rated games in the last 6 years. To the correct audience, it can be a very entertaining and engaging game to play.
2. The reporting features are sound, according to user experience they are quite effective and of course on consoles, link into the main reporting features.
3. The tactical nature of the game, to the right age group, can be particularly good for the mind, as you will be making decisions under pressure that effect how you do on the game.



## Negative Points

1. Because of the nature of the game, it is inherently violent, which to younger users can cause a problem.
2. Another concern we have, which there is some evidence around scientifically, is the risk of 'de-sensitisation' to terror incidents in the real world, because they attribute it to a game.
3. Like any online game, involving mic chats and violent games, there is a risk that some users may experience abuse online, so it is very important to openly communicate with your children.
